

Goodbyes are hard. We don't get a script of how to do them. We don't always know what to say or what to do. The truth is, for most of us, if given the choice, we would simply avoid goodbyes. I learned this about myself the first time I went to church camp. My first experience at church camp was typical.

When I arrived, I was a bit nervous and anxious not knowing what to expect. Like all new campers, I worried about things like: Would I be able to sleep at night? Would I like the food? Would I be homesick? Would I like my counselor? But...more importantly would I make friends? The first two days seemed so long as I tried to acclimate and navigate this new situation, but by day three at camp it felt like home.

The rest of the week went quickly in comparison to the first part of the week. It seemed as campers (perhaps for the counselors and staff as well) that we had just said hello and now we were saying our goodbyes.

I will never forget how I felt the Saturday morning my parents came back to camp to pick me up. There was such a sense of urgency on my part. As we were loading up my stuff, at one point my parents turned to me and said, "Is there anyone that you want to say goodbye to?" Quickly I responded, "No, I just want to go home." I wanted to avoid the awkwardness of not really knowing what to say or do. I wanted to avoid the risk of getting emotional in front of others. I wanted to avoid the goodbye.

When I got back home, I learned the importance of goodbye as I felt the pangs of regret. Eventually, I realized that I had missed an opportunity that I would never get back. As an adult, when I find myself leaning toward avoiding a goodbye, I recall this first learning about the importance of goodbyes. Over the years, I have learned what can linger when I do not participate in a goodbye.

Goodbyes are natural part of the continually changing life of a church. I have been

Remind one another that as you say goodbye you will be surrounded by the love you have shared, the promises of God, the presence of Jesus Christ, and the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

The Festival of Faith 2017 is an event for 6th-8th graders and their chaperones. It will take place on February 18-19 (Saturday & Sunday) at DuBois Center. We welcome **Jay Tyson** from St Paul UCC Waterloo as the event's new leader and thank him for taking on this exciting, but

challenging, responsibility! Please note the important dates - **January 24 for space requests** and **February 6 for paperwork /payment to the ISC office**. The [packet](#) has been emailed to all of the churches and youth leaders in an effort to be green and to save on mailing costs. However, we would be happy to mail hard copies to churches if requested.

Blessing in Blocks! During February 4-13, 2017 a team of four people, representing two ISC congregations will be building in Catamayo - Ecuador which is in the province of Loja just north of Peru. This will be our tenth building project in Catamayo. While it might seem that this is a small team to build a house, there will be an Ecuadorian foreman and a couple of masons, some members of the family that will purchase the home from Habitat Ecuador, the Habitat coordinator and some volunteers from a local church, so there will be enough people to do the work. However, since there are so few ISC traveler's congregations represented in which we can raise money for building materials we are hoping that people in the other ISC churches will become involved in the Blessings in Blocks program. During past years people from about 1/3 of the ISC churches have been involved in this "Blessings in Blocks" materials funding process.

We have taken around two hundred 3x5 cards with blessings for the family written



on them to each of the building projects during the past 9 years. Some of the cards arrive at the Highland office with a check for building materials, however, most of them do not. While we are very pleased to have the cards and appreciate the thoughtfulness involved in sending them to the Highland office, this time we need a lot more of them to include checks for \$5, \$10 or \$20.

During recent trips we have asked the homebuyer family members to place the cards in the blocks as the blocks are handed to those who are building the wall. This seems to be very meaningful to our partner families.

Perhaps it is impractical for you to go on one of these building trips. However, this is a way that you can have a very specific role in the success of this ministry. We would much prefer to have 300 people who would send a card with a check for \$10 than to have 30 people send a card with \$100. It really touches the families in Ecuador that hundreds of people who they will never meet want to be involved in helping to build their new home.
