ELEPHANT THINKING

Whenever, I hear phrases like, "We tried that before." "But we have always done it that way." or "That just won't work here," I think of what social scientists call elephant thinking.

When elephants are being trained for the circus, trainers start when the elephants are still small, tie a strong rope around their necks, and attach the rope to a secure pole.

The baby elephants naturally try to walk away and are stopped by the rope. They pull, push, twist, turn, and eventually figure out that they just aren't strong enough to break free of their shackles, so they stop resisting and just stay where they are.

The next time they tie up the baby elephants they try to break away once again, pulling on the rope to see if they can go free. When they figure out that once again it is futile, they stop pulling, settle down, and stay where they are.

The same thing happens repeatedly until eventually, when the ropes are put over their heads, they no longer pull, push, and try to break free because they know it is futile.

That is why you can walk by a circus and see giant elephants standing passively with a rope tied around their necks that isn't attached to anything at all.

The elephant becomes so accustomed to being held back by the rope, that merely the rope itself keeps the animal in check. If only they knew how powerful they really are.

If only they realized that by the time they have grown up, even a rope "secured" to a pole can no longer contain them. As a full-grown elephant, they can weigh up to six tons, which means they could practically sneeze and pull out the pole out of the ground, but they do not try.

Social scientists point out there is a parallel phenomenon in human behavior calling it simply elephant thinking.

This assumed constraint is a belief based on experiences of the past, embedded in your mind at a very early age. This happens not only with individuals, but also in groups of people. We can see it in ourselves; we can see it in others; and we can see it in our churches.

When we focus on times when things WERE difficult - times when we felt that we weren't strong enough to move forward - we unknowingly convince ourselves that maybe we should just stop and stay where we are.

We become too focused on what has happened in the past; eyes cast on the ground.

We lose our ability to dream and visualize the life and future that God has planned for us.

Yet, the good news is the elephant could set himself free, if only he chose.

We can do the same for ourselves, if only we choose to trust in God's vision for us.

When we get stuck in elephant thinking in our personal lives, in our churches, in our Conference and in our world, I believe we need to challenge ourselves and be willing to ask ourselves some vital questions.

Do we believe in God's vision for us?

Or are we frantic in fearful action?
Can we hear the word of the Lord?
Are we still listening?

When we are stuck in elephant thinking, it would be good for us to remember the message of the prophet Jeremiah, "For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for good and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." - *Jeremiah 29: 11*

Volunteer Spotlight - Larry Reeble

Dedicated, caring, passionate and hard-working - that's Larry Reeble, a dedicated volunteer who goes above and beyond. Larry was first "roped" into volunteering at DuBois Center in 1986 by his wife Sue who was an active summer camp volunteer at the time; he's been hooked ever since. Then Conference Minister, Rev. Martha Baumer, asked him to help rebuild the horse program. That year he traveled throughout the Midwest - 4,982 miles to be exact - to find good, solid horses for the program. Over the years, Larry has helped to find and vet many new additions to the herd, and even donated a few of his own. At the youthful age of 81, Larry

is still very active at DuBois Center. He is a member of our equestrian committee and leads dozens of rides each year for Nature's Classroom students and guest groups. He can also be found mowing pastures, mending fences, and helping in other areas throughout camp. When asked what keeps him coming back, he responded simply "horses and kids." He went on to share that even during some of the most frustrating rides, when he's ready to quit, a kid will give him a hug or make him a card, and then suddenly all the aggravation is worth it. Over the years, Larry has touched the lives of so many people - children, youth and adults, campers, guests and volunteer alike. A fellow volunteer remarked, "He seems to draw strength and endurance from DuBois and helping people and horses." And what would a horse ride be without Larry's trademark advice; "Always keep the horse between you and the ground." We are grateful for Larry and his knowledge, kind-heart and generosity!

Blessing in Blocks

During February 4-13, 2017 a team of four people, representing two ISC congregations will be building our 10th building in Catamayo - Ecuador. Since there are so few ISC travelers' congregations represented in which we can raise money for building materials, we are hoping that people in the other ISC churches will become involved in the Blessings in Blocks program. We have taken around two hundred 3x5 cards with blessings for the family written on them to each of the building projects during the past 9 years. Some of the cards arrive at the Highland office with a check for building materials. While we are very pleased to have the cards and appreciate the

thoughtfulness involved in sending them to the Highland office, this time we need a lot more of them to include checks for \$5, \$10 or \$20.

During recent trips we have asked the homebuyer family members to place the cards in the blocks as the blocks are handed to those who are building the wall.
