A LEGACY OF LOVE

In 2011, the Illinois South Conference received a bequest from the Marion Mittendorf estate that was to be used within a five year time frame. For many years, it was assumed that this bequest was only to be used to help those who had suffered from national disasters. However, recently, we in the Conference did some research to discover and clarify the parameters of the fund. Our primary goal was to honor the intentions and wishes of Marion and Richard Mittendorf in how they would have wanted the monies to be gifted.

With the help of legal counsel in going back to the last will and testament, we discovered two important things: First, the

highest priority of the Mittendorf fund was that the monies would be used for missions that supported children and families who were victims of natural disasters and those who were struggling because of crises and financial hardships. Secondly, that the Illinois South Conference was to serve in the role of being the executors of the estate, making sure that the money would be used to help those in the greatest and immediate need.

Thanks to Shirley Bergmann and Carol Faust, we also found in our files, sixty original letters Marion had handwritten to the Illinois South Conference that included instructions about how to use checks she had enclosed in the amounts most often of \$300 to \$500 for a variety of mission projects.

Here is just one excerpt from one of those letters that was included with her \$500 check.

I hear the words of Jesus that remind me, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.' I hope this gift will be able to help the littlest ones among us-the children. They are precious gifts from God. I am sure there are many, many needs. Thank you for taking care of this for us and please send it where the need is the greatest. May God bless you all as you labor for Him.

In almost all of the letters Marion sent to the Conference with her financial gifts, she closed with some variation of these words...*Thank you for taking care of this for us and please send it where the need is the greatest.*

It became clear to us that Marion had entrusted us with the important work of using these monies where the need was the greatest. For many of us in Illinois South Conference the mission and work of Uni-Pres Kindercottage has been near and dear to our hearts. We, in the Illinois South Conference, clearly heard the many voices of those who have been deeply concerned that Kindercottage may not be able to keep their doors open due to the drastic cuts in government funding.

After prayerful discernment, conversations with those who knew Marion and Richard Mittendorf, and thoughtful consideration of how they would have wanted those monies to be used, we decided one area of greatest and immediate need in our community would be for the paying down of the mortgage of Kindercottage.

Hunger Action Committee Workshop Series

At the ISC Annual Meeting in October 2015, the Hunger Action Committee shared the "good news" that 100% of churches in the Illinois South Conference of the United Church of Christ are involved with food ministries. Many of these are local interfaith alliances. We have discovered that the food ministry leaders often do not hear about available funds and resources. Here's your chance to help these dedicated people share ideas to "feed hungry people."

On October 14, 2014, the Community Interfaith Food Pantry dedicated its new home at 1218 W. Main in Belleville. In the old facility, patrons were crowded out the front door. Volunteers ran into each other trying to navigate carts through the small rooms and the limited storage space filled up fast. Generous donors, their hard-working board and volunteers and a generous grant from the Alan Shawn Feinstein Foundation made possible the current spacious facility in a visible and accessible location on West Main. The Pantry is open 4 days a week.

Who and what is the Feinstein Foundation and can you apply for a grant? Come to the workshop to learn more.

The Center for Progressive Renewal is offering a summer semester online UCC History, Polity and Theology class beginning on May 31 and ending August 16. The class has met the polity requirements of most Committees on Ministry in the UCC, and has been accepted as a for credit course over nine seminaries, including Union (NYC), Vanderbilt, Candler, Columbia, Lexington, Eden, and Lancaster and a number of others. It is a rigorous, engaging class that is convenient for those who are bi-vocational, have full schedules, or odd sleep habits! It is designed to meet the needs of students with different learning styles and varying levels of formal education. 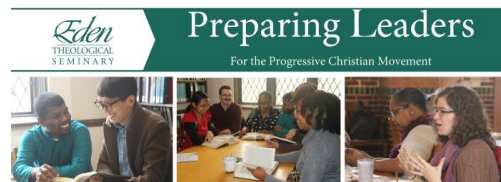
