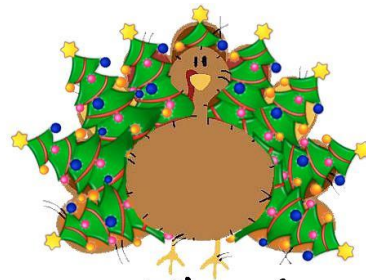

This year's trophy winner was Hoyleton Trinity Lutheran Church. There were 60 youth and adults who gathered from 4 churches, Grace United Methodist Church, St. Ann Catholic Church, Hoyleton Trinity Lutheran and the St. Paul United Church of Christ. Thanks to the communities' generosity,

this group collected over 3,300 items which were used to stock the shelves at the Washington County Food Pantry in Irvington. In addition, they were able to complete 70+ Thanksgiving bags, which contained all the items needed to fix a Thanksgiving meal, including a turkey, thanks to the fundraising efforts of St. Paul UCC in Nashville.

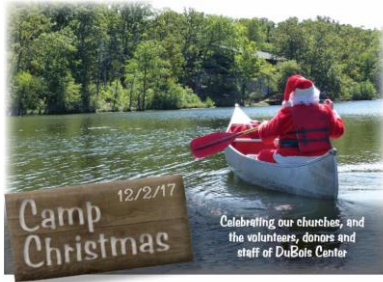

Hoyleton Youth and Family Services Celebrates National Adoption Day



On Saturday, November 18, 2017, Hoyleton Youth and Family Services celebrated the joys of adoption and encouraged more people to give children permanent families through adoption. Through its broad spectrum of residential and community-based programming, Hoyleton Youth and Family Services enriches the lives of over 2,300 individuals each year. A reception followed at The Foundry Public House, 126 N Main St Edwardsville, IL.

This celebration was part of a nationwide effort to call special attention to the 100,000 foster children waiting in the United States for adoption, and celebrated all loving families that adopt.

"Uniting a child with a family who loves them is one of the best opportunities I have as a Judge to help our community" Judge Sarah Smith says about the program. Judge Smith is the chair of this year's National Adoption Day ceremony. "National Adoption Day is a day to celebrate with the children who have found their forever home, and to raise awareness for children in foster care waiting to find permanent, loving families. This is our second year celebrating his special occasion and we are excited to see that this event has grown even bigger this year."

Since 1987, the number of children in foster care nationally has doubled, and the average time a child remains in foster care has lengthened to nearly three years. Each year, approximately 28,000 children in foster care will age out of the system without ever being with a permanent family. More than 17,000 children are in foster care in Illinois; 3,347 of these children are waiting for adoptive families.

"For some of these children, they are now part of a new family. Many have had a difficult journey getting to this point, but the reward and opportunity are great," said Sharon McDevitt, Director of Child Welfare for Hoyleton. "This is a new birthday for these children."
