UCC Mourns Marilyn Breitling, UCC's First Woman National Executive

The United Church of Christ lost a strong leader and role model with the death of Marilyn Breitling on Tuesday, May 22. She was 84. Breitling led the UCC around women's issues in the 1970's and 1980's. In 1979, she became the first Executive Director of the Coordinating Center for Women in Church and Society (CCW). When the office was given instrumentality status-the equivalent of a covenanted ministry-by General Synod in 1987, Breitling became the first woman to lead the church on a national level. PALLETS - Your Trash, Our Treasure

We've got HAY! After a very dry end to the 2017 growing season, our supply was running low. Now, in preparation for heavy summer rains, additional sturdy wooden pallets on which to set the bales are needed. Storing hay off the ground keeps it out of the mud. The drier the bales remain, the more able we are to reduce the growth of mold. Mold contributes to large amounts of waste. In addition, moldy hay is not healthy for our horses. Keeping the hay drier also helps to retain its nutritional content throughout the year. Approximately 30 additional new or gently used sturdy pallets are needed.
