Listening with an Open Mind

"The Lord said to Moses, I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are...But Moses implored the Lord his God...And the Lord changed his mind about the disaster that he planned to bring on his people."

- Exodus 32:9-14 excerpts (NRSV)

One of the most important issues of a relationship is the ability to listen, discern what is best, and have a flexible enough mind to see the situation from another point of view.

When my son was about 10 years old, he was having trouble with math. I was trying to explain the new information to him, but I could see in his eyes that he was having an internal conversation, "I'll never learn this new math. I've told her and told her that I'm too stupid to understand. I don't know why she continues to try. I just can't get it!" Mind you, all this time I'm giving him step-by-step instructions (which he didn't hear) about how to do it.


I asked, "Do you understand now?" Of course, the answer was no because he had been too busy listening to his internal monologue. I repeated the how-to information while periodically interrupting his monologue with, "Did you get that part? We can't move on until you do." It seemed to break the recording repeating in his brain AND he learned.

This is not an unusual phenomenon among the human race. We focus on the small bit of information that we have, and our brains snap shut without considering another avenue. People around us can be giving us more vital information with which to make a decision, but we do not hear it because we have already made a decision without all of the information available.

The people that Moses brought out of Egypt didn't have all the information, so they made decisions based on their old way of thinking. God was disappointed and ready to give them his wrath through disasters. But Moses intervened with more information, and God took that into consideration. If

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

An Ecclesiastical Council is an official meeting of the Illinois South Conference acting as an Association. Delegates from each congregation and all United Church of Christ ordained and licensed ministers with standing in the Conference are called to be present for this meeting. Local churches are entitled to the same number of voting delegates as for any meeting of the Conference.

WHY ARE WE MEETING?

To examine Tim Powers-Reed, a Member in Discernment of Illinois South Conference, for ordained ministry. Tim has completed the preparation steps for ordination, was examined by the Illinois South Conference Committee on Ministry, and was approved as a candidate for an Ecclesiastical Council. It is now the task of the Ecclesiastical Council (the gathered body of voting delegates of our Conference) to discern if Tim is worthy of ordination in the United Church of Christ.

HOW CAN WE PREPARE?

Please download Tim's ordination <u>paper</u> and the <u>document</u> entitled "The Church's Expectations of Its Candidates for Ordination," at the links above. Copies can also be accessed on our Conference website at <u>iscucc.org</u>. Please make copies for other delegates or share the papers so they can read these materials before the meeting. During the Zoom event, delegates can ask the candidate questions about the ordination paper and call to ministry.


