Perhaps we do not see the entire picture and, therefore, are resistant to the direction that this Unseen Force is pushing us toward. If we accept that God is guiding us, we can stop fighting against the wind and find that life is much easier when going with the Unseen Force instead of against it. May we all move on the path that the Unseen Force of God is pushing us toward.

Each year, Nollau brings together a community of leaders committed to creating a just, caring, and compassionate world. Cultivating this connection between others, the world, and within themselves is the heart of the Nollau experience.

Through retreats, online interactions, and peer mentoring, this program supports leadership formation through a variety of learning modalities and within a community of practice. The
