Murmuration

"...so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others." – Romans 12:5 (NIV) It is fall and time for the migration of birds who

winter in the south. It's the time I love to watch the murmuration or flock of migrating black birds as they fly in precise movements, creating miraculous designs in the sky. It's rather like watching clouds and picking out designs in them. This week, the phenomenon of a murmuration almost made me pull over to the side of the road and watch the wonder of it all.

As I pondered the beauty before me, questions clouded my mind. What kind of birds are they? Why do they fly in this synchronistic flight? How do they know which way to fly?

After some investigation, I learned that most commonly the birds are starlings, and naming it a murmuration rather than a flock is due to the sound their wings make as they fly...as if a person murmuring. But the murmuration is not limited to starlings. At times, blackbirds (red winged blackbirds and/or Common Grackles) are a large part of the murmuration. They fly together as a means of protection from predators who have difficulty focusing on one bird when they move as a group, and the birds in the murmuration help each other find food along the way. The birds pay attention to several birds surrounding them to intuit when it is time to move or change directions.

It popped in my head that this murmuration was very similar to being in community. We are all humans although we may not have the same cultural heritage. We are moving together in this world and
