Giving Thanks

When I was younger, and my family would embark on a road trip, my siblings and I would play our version of the car spotting game. The idea was to spot as many types of a particular car as possible in a set time. We would either name a car color (say red) or a make and model of car (our favorite was a Volkswagen Beetle) and set a timer. We would look intensely at the passing views, hoping to see that type of car first. The person who saw the most cars matching the agreed-upon description won.

I was always struck by how many red cars, or Volkswagen Beetles, I saw long after we finished the game. I had never noticed them before, and now I saw them everywhere. I marveled at the mystery of how many of these cars suddenly appeared around me. As I got older, I realized it wasn't so mysterious. In fact, there is a coined term explaining this mystery--the Baader-Meinhof phenomenon. It explains that when you learn about something or focus on something, it suddenly appears everywhere because you have trained your brain to look for it.

This is the key to gratitude. I believe gratitude begins with intentional noticing. What we train our brain to look for is what seems to appear everywhere. If we cannot see that which is lovely, commendable, and worthy of our praise, how can we experience appreciation for it? The spiritual discipline of choosing to notice that which is good, beautiful, and joyful leads to gratitude.

And so, in this season of Thanksgiving, I encourage you to try and look for the things in your life and our world for which you can be grateful. Practice the art of noticing as recommended in Philippians 4:8-9, *"Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things."*
