# Look Full in His Wonderful Face

In the first chapter of the Gospel of Mark, verse 15, we read

Jesus' first word as he begins in public ministry, "The time has come, the kingdom of God is near." The Message, a modern translation of the Bible, says, "The time is fulfilled," which is essentially a way of saying, "Time's up." Another way of reading this is, "Quit your waiting; now is the time. The world God designed and desires for humanity can happen now."

How? How can the world God designed and desires for humanity happen now? The first action Jesus demands of humanity to usher in the kingdom of God is repentance. Now, I realize that when most people hear the word repent, they think confess as if Jesus is demanding that we drop to our knees and recite a laundry list of all our sins. And while confession is good for the soul; confessing, admitting our mistakes, and admitting we have a problem can be the beginning of taking action, yet this is not necessarily what Jesus means.

metanoia, which is better translated to mean turn around or change. The first action Jesus asks his disciples then and now to take is to change. We must change our thinking, actions, focus, and lives from this world to the world God desires us to create.

In his letter to the church in Rome, the apostle Paul summarizes Jesus' call to bring forth the kingdom of God. As Paul says in Romans 12:2, "Do not conform to the pattern of this world yet be changed (transformed) by the renewing of your mind."

The beginning of belief and living out one's faith begins with changing one's focus from worldly values to Godly values. God became flesh in the one we call Emmanuel, God with us, the one we know as Jesus Christ so that we would know what God values through Christ's example.


