

Our Conference Minister Reflects on God's Unending Love



When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "What shall we do?" Acts 2:37

On the day of Pentecost, when those gathered questioned the meaning of the Divine outpouring, Peter stood up to testify. With passion and urgency, Peter explained this powerful moment was not meant to be a rare occurrence. Rather, it would be just the beginning of God's plan for people to profoundly experience the transforming power and presence of the Risen Lord.

The Divine fires of Pentecost were not intended to be fleeting flames. They were designed to be explosive sparks that could ignite generations to experience the truth

and light of the One whom death could not defeat. Yet, as Peter explained to the crowd, the Holy Spirit could only continue to burn if there were those who were committed to tending the flame.

In response, the hearers of Peter's message asked the most crucial question, "What shall we do?" Not, "Well, what are you going to do?" Or "What is that to us?" With a sense of ownership, they asked, "What shall we do?"

Equipping those first believers to be a part of building what would become the Church of Jesus Christ, Peter imparted this clear directive, ""Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call."

This is still the directive and call for all those who want to ensure the power and presence of the Holy Spirit is alive and burning in our churches and the world. Yet, we often wait for others to fan the flames and do the Spirit work.

When we experience the smoldering embers of faith, let us ask ourselves the question those first believers asked: "What shall **WE** do?" And then, may we remember that we are the ones who are called to tend to our faith lives first so that the passion and fires of our faith can ignite others.
