



Our Conference Minister Reflects on God's Unending Love



"Do you not care that we are perishing?" -- Mark 4:38

The sky had darkened, the winds had shifted, and the rain was incredibly intense. For Andrew, Peter, James, and John, as trained fishermen, perhaps collective experience had taught them these were the signs of a dangerous voyage. Yet, nothing in the Gospel of Mark's retelling of this event indicates that the situation warranted the outcome they feared was inevitable.

The inevitable outcome they were fearing was the worst-case scenario. In our mind's eye, we can almost see their panic and maybe even frustration as they approach a sleeping Jesus at the back of the vessel, awakening him with the question, "Do you not care that we are perishing?"

I wonder if Jesus' response stung a bit. Instead of taking stock of the weather conditions or matching their frantic energy, Jesus speaks calm into being. By the power of His word and presence, the waters are stilled. Yet, instead of turning to the disciples to join in a sense of relief, Jesus seized the opportunity to create a teachable moment by asking them two pointed questions: "What are you afraid of? Have you still no faith?"

In interpreting this text, many hear Jesus' words as a rebuke. Yet, I believe his questioning might not also be seen as a loving de-escalation redirect. I need such a redirect when I am spiraling down a neuronal pathway, convinced of the peril that awaits me. It takes a pattern interrupter to redirect my swirling thoughts and the pit in my stomach feelings.

When I am freaking out, I might want someone to affirm that "Yes, indeed, we are perishing," but that is not what I need. What I need is a pattern interrupter. I need someone to say, "Really? What are you afraid of? Is this situation going to kill? Or is it just temporarily painful, hurtful, or uncomfortable?"

I need someone to say, "Where is your faith? God has led you this far, so what makes you think God will abandon you now?" I need someone to remind me that the One who can direct the sea and the wind to obey is the One who can and will direct my life if I follow and trust in the promises of hope instead of falling victim to the falsehoods of fear.

When the weather conditions of your life rapidly change, and you cannot see past the darkness that has crept in, you may wonder, "Jesus, do you not care that I am perishing?" Take a moment and listen. Listen, and you may hear the tender voice of Jesus saying, "Dear One, what are you so afraid of? Be still, have faith, and know peace will come."
