



Our Conference Minister Reflects on God's Unending Love





Calling Potential Delegates for General Synod 35

We are looking for a few dedicated church leaders to serve as delegates for General Synod 35, held July 11-15, 2025, in Kansas City, Missouri. While the summer of 2025 seems far off, our Conference recruitment committee will present a slate of nominees for the Illinois South Conference General Synod 35 delegates to our Annual Meeting on October 19, 2024.



General Synod is an incredible opportunity to witness the covenant of the Church and the commitments of the United Church of Christ as a whole.

The gathered assembly of voting delegates is responsible for making decisions concerning speaking to the Church (not for the Church) concerning evangelistic, mission, and justice matters. Voting delegates serve on behalf of their Conference so that they can return and share what they saw, experienced, and learned with the local churches of the Conference.

Delegates will experience intense immersion opportunities before General Synod through pre-meetings, during General Synod as they attend worship services, educational events, committee work, and business meetings, and afterward through offering resources and follow-up opportunities with the churches of the Illinois South Conference. While at General Synod, delegates quickly discover the days and the distances they will walk are long, but the experience of being a part of the Church at work and wonder will be long-lasting as well.

Currently, the Recruitment Committee is looking to fill the following delegate positions:

1 lay woman, 1 authorized woman, 1 lay man under 30, 1 lay woman under 30, and 2 lay men. They will also be looking for those who can commit to being alternates. We will need the following alternate delegate positions: 1 alternate authorized man, 2 alternate authorized women, 2 alternate lay men, and 2 alternate women.
