

Reflections from Our Conference Minister



For some, Advent can seem like a strange season. While the rest of the world rushes headlong

from Thanksgiving into Christmas lights, shopping lists, and celebrations, Advent stands quietly in the doorway, inviting us not to hurry—but to pause. To wait. To listen. Uncomfortable with this waiting, many approach Advent like a countdown game.

Evidence of this can be found in the plethora of Advent calendars now available. There are chocolate Advent calendars, beer Advent calendars, coffee Advent calendars, makeup Advent calendars, candle Advent calendars, Lego Advent calendars, and just about every imaginable thing that is small enough to fit in a box has been made into an Advent

calendar.

Last year, my parents gave my dogs an Advent calendar. Every day I opened a perforated flap and pulled out that day's treat. It was delightful for them, but not exactly spiritual. And that's the problem: when we treat Advent as a simple countdown to Christmas, we miss its real purpose.

The word Advent comes from the Latin *ad venion*--"until the coming." Advent is an opportunity for us, as Christians, to reflect on our outer witness and proclamation of Christ in the world. It is a time set aside to consider how the presence of Emmanuel (God with us) can transform how we relate to one another, love one another, and further the reign of Christ in the world.

Advent invites us to consider: What difference does Christ's coming make? What difference can it make—still—in our world, in our families, in our own hearts?

Advent is a season of holy imagination.

Not imagining what is, but what could be through the power and presence of Christ.

This holy imaging is not only about what Jesus brought into the world, but what we—made in God's image—are called to bring now.

So, in this season of waiting, may your spirit be guiet enough to listen.

May your heart soften enough to hope.

May your mind lift high enough to see Christ's vision for humanity—visions of peace, reconciliation, compassion, and radiant love.

And as we wait "until the coming," may Christ reveal how you can carry Christ's light:

How might you bring **hope** to someone who feels forgotten?

How might you bring peace to a tense situation or troubled heart?

How might you bring joy where heaviness lingers?

How might you bring **love** in ways that reflect the very heart of God?

This---dear friends—is the invitation of Advent:

Not a countdown, but a calling.

Not a race to Christmas, but a readiness for Christ.

May you enter this holy season aware, expectant, and willing to shine the light of Christ even in the darkest corners of the world.


The Christmas Fund reflects on hope, peace, joy and love: Congregations 'give their hearts' to help others by Donna Jackson | published on Dec 2, 2025

Sabell Wave of Prayer


