We are going to finish the Christmas Season with the celebration of Epiphany, the arrival of the Wise Men seeking baby Jesus. Quite frankly every day of our

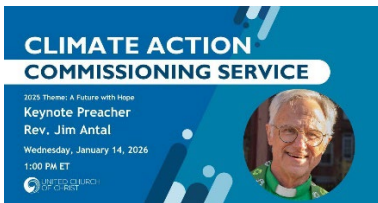
