## Reflections From Our Conference Minister

In this liturgical season of Pentecost, as we celebrate the movement of the Holy Spirit in Acts 2 and reflect on the doctrine of the Holy Spirit on Trinity Sunday, we must not assume that the Spirit enters the biblical story only after Jesus' death and resurrection.

The power and presence of God's Spirit are woven through the sacred texts from the very beginning. In the first creation story in Genesis 1, before God even formed the earth, the Spirit of God was "hovering over the waters" (Genesis 1:2). In the second creation story, which centers on the creation of humanity, God's breath becomes the breath of life that brings forth every living being (Genesis 2:7).

Throughout the Old Testament, the Spirit of God moves powerfully in the lives of those who encounter the Holy One—speaking, directing, encouraging, and empowering them to live as God intends for the beloved community.

Throughout Jesus' life, from beginning to end, the Spirit of God remains a constant companion—bringing forth life in Mary's womb, naming and claiming him at the waters of the Jordan River, sustaining him through temptation in the wilderness, equipping him to heal the sick and brokenhearted, and raising him from death in a sealed tomb.

The overflowing power of the Spirit of God is central to the Pentecost event, but it is not a new story; rather, it is a new chapter in the ongoing witness of God's power in the world.

As we consider the ways the Spirit of God consistently appears in our sacred texts, may we also consider the ways the Spirit is to show up and move in our lives today.

For the power of the One who creates us remains the same. And each creature and created one is guided, nudged, and nourished by the Spirit of God to discover their life's purpose and to live as God's beloved in connection, relationship, and covenant with God and one another.

And as long as this world endures, and there is breath in the lungs of creation and humanity, the Spirit of God will be alive and stronger than any other power or force on this earth. Dear friends, may this be what we celebrate and remember in this season of Pentecost.

## A PRAYER FOR THE SEASON OF PENTECOST

O Spirit of the Living God,  
who hovered over the waters of creation,  
O Divine Breath, who filled humanity with life,  
we give thanks that Your presence has never left this world.

O Holy Spirit, from the beginning of time,  
You have filled the minds and hearts of Your people,  
emboldening them to speak and act courageously on Your behalf.

In this season of Pentecost, O Holy One,  
may we remember that the song of Your Spirit  
is not merely an ancient refrain,  
but a living melody that still attunes our hearts  
to Your grace and mercy,  
teaching us to live in covenant with You and with one another.

And when the powers of evil in this world seem insurmountable,  
Eternal Spirit, remind us that Your Spirit is stronger still.  
For as long as there is breath in creation,  
Your presence endures,  
Your love remains,  
and Your power brings forth life  
even in places of death and destruction.

O Holy Spirit,  
our Advocate,  
our Comforter,  
our Counselor,  
be with us now and forevermore. Amen
