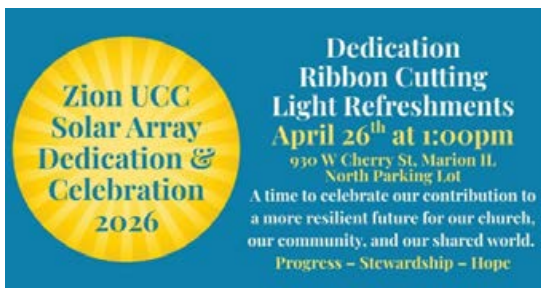


April 25th: Earth Summit
